This report has been prepared for the November 17, 2011 Edmonton Police Commission meeting.

During the month of October 2011, Professional Standards Branch opened 98 new files:

- 8 Public complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 9 Internal complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 16 EPS Matters; and
- 65 Citizen Contacts.

Additionally, 1 file was directed for Criminal Investigation (*Statutory Complaints*).

Concluded 79 files:

- 0 Public *Statutory* complaint;
- 1 Internal *Statutory* complaint;
- 11 Public complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*, including 3 complaints regarding policies or services provided by the EPS;
- 1 Internal complaint as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 16 EPS Matters; and
- 50 Citizen Contacts.

The Edmonton Police Service received 40,891 calls in Communications Section, dispatched 12,752 of those calls, and recorded receiving 26 compliments.

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October 2011 OVERVIEW & UPDATES

The PSB restructuring pilot project was commenced on October 3, 2011. This was referenced in last month's update and deals with the restructuring of the investigative portion of PSB into three teams, each led by a Primary Investigator under the supervision of a single Investigative Supervisor (Team Commander). The project has been well received by staff. New workflow and processes have been established, and staff are adapting well. Early indications are very positive.

The restructured teams were put to the test during the first week of October, when PSB was assigned to complete a large criminal investigation into an incident that occurred in Penhold, Alberta, in late September 2011. The EPS had a large number of officers deployed to this location to participate in Public Safety Section (crowd control) training exercises. One member of the EPS was suspended with pay on October 5, 2011. This investigation commanded the majority of the attention of two of the three teams for a good portion of October. An overseer from Alberta Justice has been appointed to participate in the ongoing investigation.

During the first week of October, PSB was provided with additional funding to continue with the file-scanning project that was initiated during the summer months. Two new temporary employees have been hired and are presently in the office scanning older hard-copy files into the IAPro database.

Also during October, Chief Knecht reorganized resources within his office, which resulted in the creation of a new division that encompasses PSB, Legal Services Branch, and the Hearing Officers. As of October 10, 2011, A/Superintendent Greg Preston became the head of the "Legal and Regulatory Services Division" for the EPS.

PSB finalized the candidate reviews that were required as part of the 2011 Promotion Process. In addition to reviewing 159 applicants from across the service, PSB has reviewed four Level I-II applicants from within its own ranks. PSB managers have been working with the applicants through the various stages of the process to the end of October.

PSB has been working with Peel Regional Police Service on an audit and potential restructuring of their own Professional Standards Unit. A variety of information was shared with representatives from Peel regarding recent changes that have taken place in PSB.

On October 24, 2011, Deputy Chief Dubord and Inspector Neufeld met with representatives from the BC Ministry of the Attorney General in relation to the implementation of their proposed independent investigative body, the Independent Investigations Office (IIO). The group was interested in the experiences of EPS as they relate to the development of and operational interactions with ASIRT.

During October, PSB sent two investigators to the National Internal Affairs Investigators Association (NIAIA) conference in Charlotte, North Carolina. The conference was well attended by delegates from both the US and Canada and reportedly provided excellent information and value. The officers who attended are presenting to the rest of the staff at PSB's November Lunch and Learn.

Finally, from October 26 to 28, 2011, Inspector Neufeld attended meetings of the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police (CACP) Professional Standards Committee in Toronto, Ontario. He presented the results of research done by Dr. Emily Batty of PSB regarding complaint trends and numbers collected from both large and small police agencies across the

country. The general finding was that the most common misconduct alleged across the country related to discreditable or disgraceful conduct by officers. This category of misconduct encompasses a wide variety of behaviours, the majority of which relate directly to the issue of professionalism. Chief Knecht has been strongly reinforcing this message with the members.

Note that Statutory Complaints typically represent a duplication of Complaint files (i.e., if a file is classified as a Statutory Complaint, there is a corresponding Complaint for the allegations of misconduct under the Police Service Regulation). For this reason, the number of active Statutory Complaints is not represented in the sum total.

Dear Sir:

I am writing in somewhat belated fashion to commend two of your officers. My mother died at home in Edmonton on July 26th of this year. As required by law, Officers Joshua Adams, badge number 3079 and officer Correy Tenney badge number 2600 came to her home to investigate her death.

This is not a comfortable type of duty and it is far removed from the usual type of activities which, to my knowledge, officers perform. Despite that, both of these men were kind, gentle and considerate, particularly officer Adams. They spoke in gentle voices, explained their purpose carefully but kindly and made me feel that they were there to be of service while fulfilling the requirements of the law.

I was most impressed with their manner. It was a difficult morning for me. My mother's death was not easy or quick. Acceding to her wishes, she remained at home, but I would have wished for medical intervention to ease her passing. Their professionalism and sensitivity made the entire event as easy as it could be.

I also have a brother with some mental health issues at home. He was allowed to go to his work where routine could help him with his grief and I was allowed to be the spokesperson for both of us. He could have been very distressed with a different scenario. Again, there was sensitivity to our needs.

I feel that frequently our police forces are unfairly maligned and want to take this opportunity to give them full credit where it was truly earned.

I also apologize for not using the officer's rank. I was too distressed to remember it.
