Who we are:

- iHuman is an Edmonton based non profit organization formed by two local artist in 1997.
- Stemming from a project known as “the gun sculpture” youth became interested and with guidance from our founders, began working on their own exhibit on anti violence – “red tear”. Both exhibits were displayed concurrently at the Alberta Gallery of Art.
- Our original mandate persists – to engage high risk youth in arts activities that led to positive social change.



Who we serve:

- youth aged 12-24 years (mostly 15-21 years)
- many are dealing with multiple issues and characteristics making their lives challenging such as poverty, addictions, mental health issues, gangs, criminal justice or child welfare systems
- as a counterbalance, these youth are often highly talented demonstrating amazing characteristics such as creativity, loyalty, perseverance, protector instincts and ambition
