This report has been prepared for the January 22, 2014, Edmonton Police Commission meeting.

During the month of December 2014, Professional Standards Branch opened 92 new files:

- 8 Public complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 1 Internal complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 5 EPS Matters; and
- 78 Citizen Contacts.

Additionally, 0 files were directed for Criminal Investigation (*Statutory Complaints*).

Concluded 53 files:

- 0 Public *Statutory* complaints;
- 2 Internal *Statutory* complaint;
- 11 Public complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*, including 2 complaints regarding policies or services provided by the EPS;
- 9 Internal complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 7 EPS Matter; and
- 23 Citizen Contacts.

The Edmonton Police Service received 33,244 calls in Communications Section, dispatched 13,186 of those calls and recorded opening 25 compliments.

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STATISTICAL SUMMARY

December Update

1. RECEIVED FILES

The following figure shows the number and type of files received during the month of December. Blue colours represent informal files and red colours represent formal investigations. Lighter shades indicate internally generated files and darker shades indicate externally generated files. As can be seen below, during the month of December, PSB received 83 informal files and 9 formal complaints.

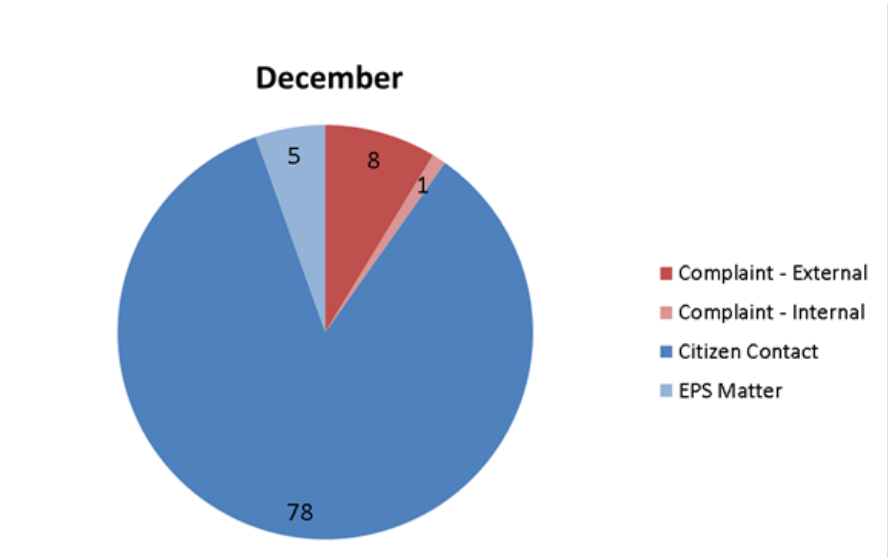


Figure 1-1. Type of Files Received During December

The following figure shows the yearly percentage increase or decrease in formal complaints and total files compared to 2013 values. The increase in total complaints represents an increase of 14 complaints (1 public complaints and 13 internal complaint), and the increase in total files represents an increase of 37 files.

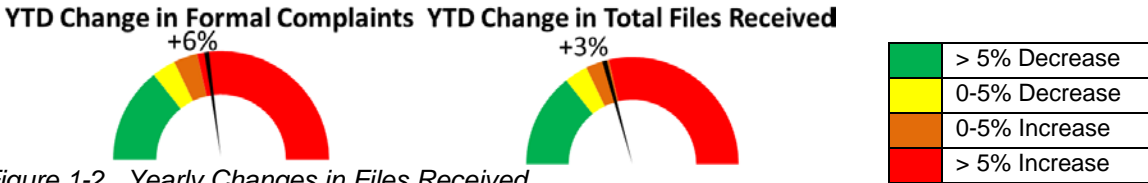


Figure 1-2. Yearly Changes in Files Received

2. CURRENT WORKLOAD

The following figure displays the status of all open PSB files. As of December 31, 2014, PSB had 539 open investigations; 272 of those files are *Police Act* or statutory investigations. The remaining files are informal concerns received internally or from the public. An investigation is listed as “Suspended” when it is not currently being advanced. Reasons for suspending a file may include executive review of the investigation, disciplinary hearings, criminal investigation, or court proceedings. An investigation is listed as “Forwarded” when it is ongoing but not under the control of PSB. Reasons for forwarding a file may include supervisory reviews, obtaining legal opinions, or investigation by outside investigators.

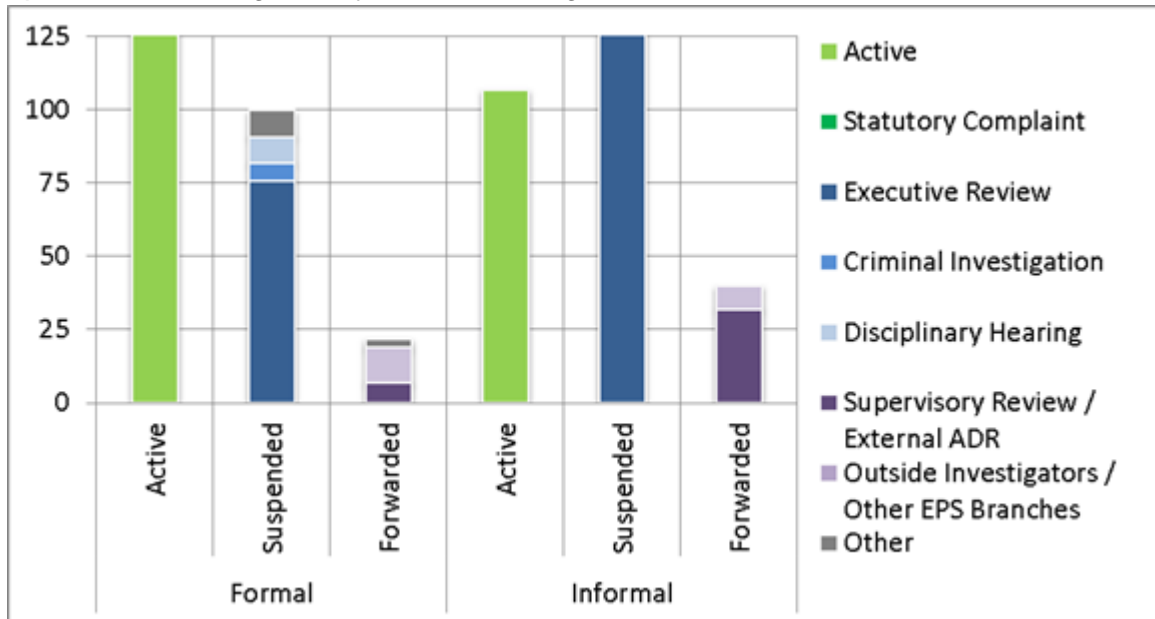


Figure 2-1. Status of All Open Investigations and Reasons for Suspension or Forward

The following figure shows the age and status of all open PSB investigations. Each individual marker (i.e., diamond, circle or triangle) represents one investigation; thus the number of open investigations from a given time period is indicated by the density of the markers.

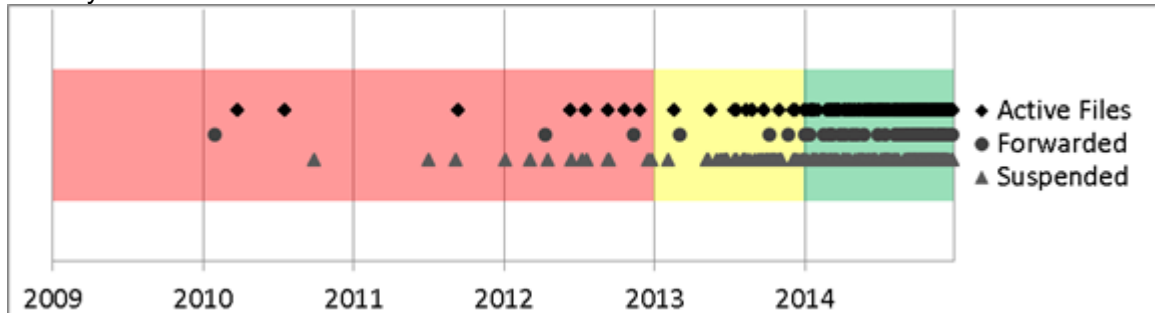


Figure 2-2. Age and Status of All Open Investigations

The following figure shows the stage of investigation for formal complaints by month. The stages of investigation include:

- Clarification (interviewing the complainant to determine the specific details of the complaint);
- Collection (collection of evidence and witness interviews);
- Subject Officer Interviews (explanatory reports and/or interview of the subject officer);
- Report (compiling the final report);
- Investigative Review (review by the investigative manager);
- Executive Review (review by the Inspector, Chief, and final concluding processes).

Investigations may also be pending other processes (e.g., dispute resolution, legal review, hearing, etc.) or may be undetermined (e.g., for complaints that are not proceeding to formal investigation).

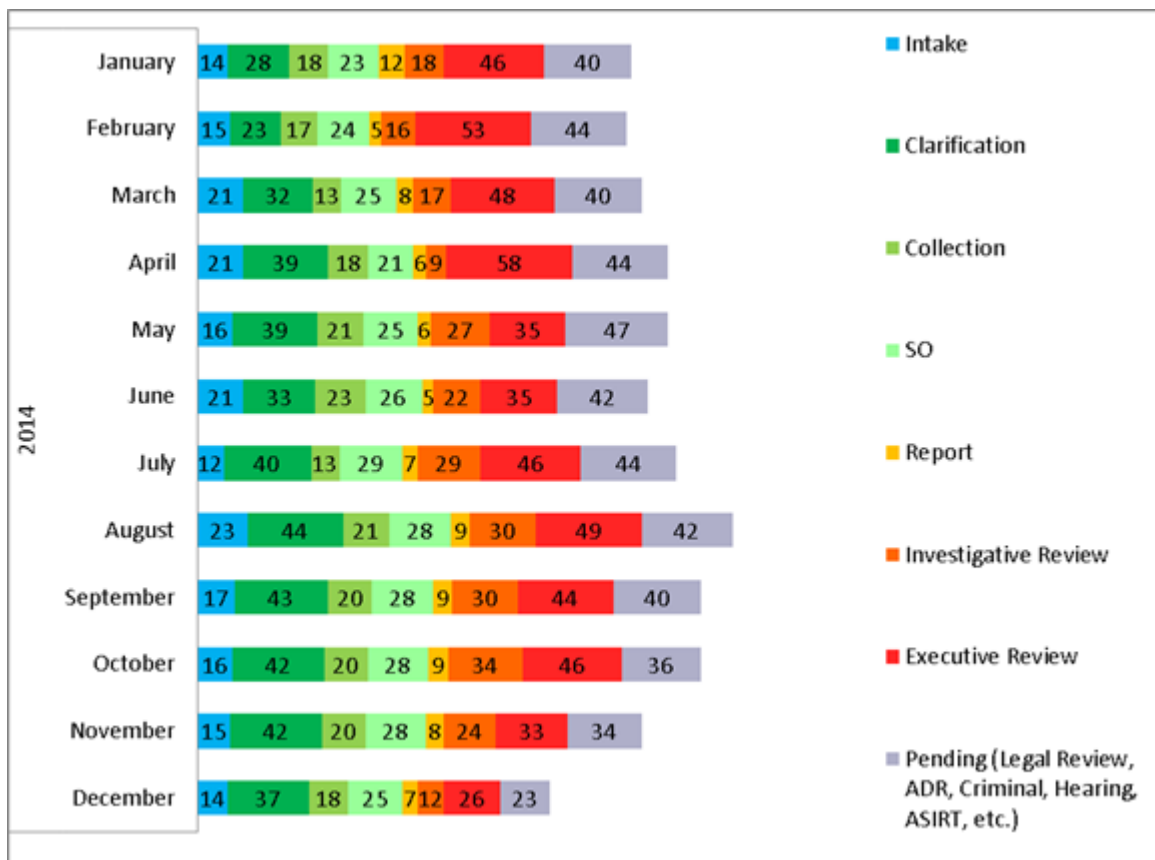


Figure 2-3. Monthly Comparison of Complaint Stages

The following figure shows the disposition of all files concluded during the month of December, including 23 formal complaints, 23 Citizen Contacts and 7 EPS Matters.

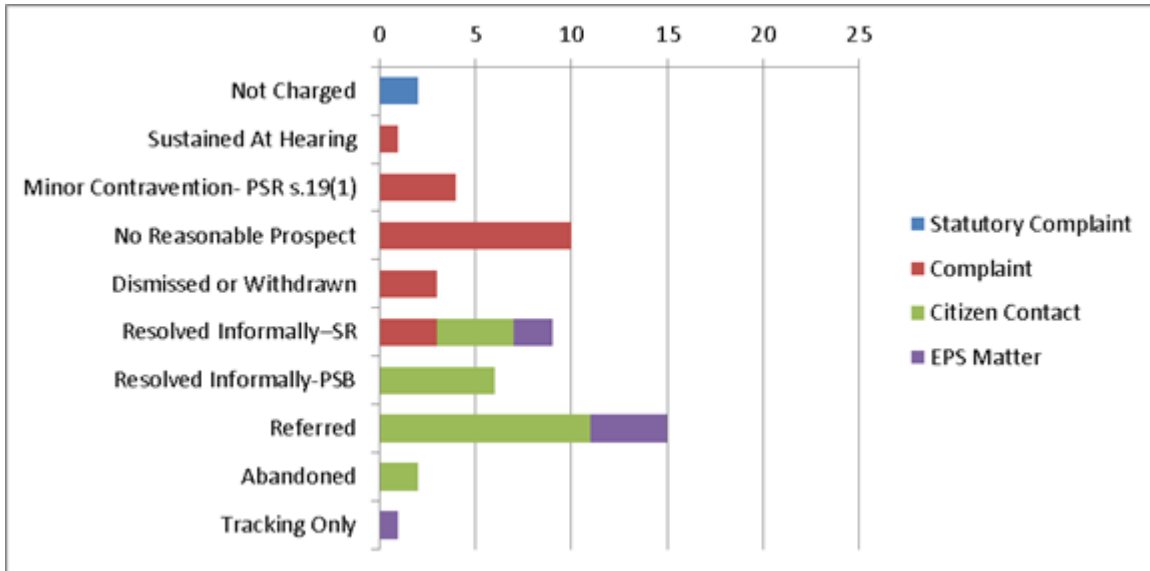


Figure 3-1. Dispositions of Concluded Files

During the month of December, twenty-five (25) letters of appreciation were entered by the Edmonton Police Service. Professional Standards Branch would like to present two (2) of these letters.

Dear Edmonton Police Service,

My name is [REDACTED], I live in Minneapolis, Minnesota. I'm writing to compliment one of your police officers. On December 10th, 2014, my girlfriend was viciously assaulted by a guy hiding in a dumpster when she went out to empty the trash behind her apartment building at [REDACTED]. He struck her multiple times breaking her nose, blackening her eyes, and then stole her iPhone before running away. She was transported by EMS to the hospital and received excellent treatment for her injuries.

Officer [REDACTED] responded to the incident. He called me from the scene, he called again to keep me updated that day, and has returned every one of my phone calls promptly and conscientiously. I promised not to call him every day and drive him insane but he said "it's okay, call anytime". I am very impressed with Officer [REDACTED] communication efforts and dedication. I live in Minnesota as I stated, I'm not an Edmonton resident. My girlfriend does live in Edmonton, but [REDACTED] has treated me as though I'm one of his cities' residents; it is very nice to have someone communicate that well in these trying times. He didn't have to accommodate me as well as he has, I really appreciate his efforts, and think his efforts should be recognized. Police work is hard, I know [REDACTED] is busy, but he finds the time to call me back within a matter of hours. That's above and beyond the call of duty in my opinion, and I thank him.

Dear Constable [REDACTED],

I am writing to let you know how your response to my house a year ago December has had a very positive impact on the stability of my troubled teenage daughter. You, along with your partner (whose name I don't have) deserve praise and recognition for your wonderful mediation skills in helping out my family.

Last December, I called the police for assistance because my then 16 year old daughter had physically attacked me and ran out of the house with my purse in retaliation for my closing her cell phone account for her behavior. This has not been the first time she has attacked me. She was very troubled because of the acrimonious divorce, and had been troubled for some time. I was saddened and frightened I had to call the police to get involved but I was up against a wall in order to get my daughter back on track. She was on a path of manipulation and physical assaults to achieve her goals. My daughter badly needed a positive male model influences and counseling. Among the negative teaching

she learned from her father, was that counselling was witchcraft and for stupid people, so of course that would be the last place she would go.

Luckily for us, you were the right person to help my daughter turn the corner. Your calm presence and respectful authority, coupled with your excellent communication skills made my daughter able to hear some common sense out of the whirlwind tornado she was inside. In effect, the rope you there out for her to catch, she caught, and she began the first step to pull herself out onto firma terra.

You encouraged her that counseling was the way to go; otherwise her path was leading her to incarceration. You made no bones about it, using real-life examples of individuals in your experience that went the wrong way.

Consequently, my daughter attended about a dozen sessions of counseling (most willingly). In about five months, by May, my daughter turned the corner and is now on a better path in life. She and I are now able to communicate more productively and she is making way better choices in decision making. Her anger has greatly dissipated. Now she seems to exhibit the regular teenage angst on the way to adulthood.

In your line of work, you must see so much negativity that I felt it important to share with you something positive.

Please share this letter with your partner at the time. Keep up the good work, and have a very Merry Christmas.
