This report has been prepared for the May 21, 2015, Edmonton Police Commission meeting.

During the month of April 2015, Professional Standards Branch received 80 new files:

- 5 Public complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 10 Internal complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 13 EPS Matters; and
- 52 Citizen Contacts.

Additionally, 8 files were directed for Criminal Investigation (*Statutory Complaints*).

Concluded 100 files:

- 1 Internal *Statutory* complaint;
- 9 Public complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*, including 2 complaint regarding policies or services provided by the EPS;
- 14 Internal complaints as defined by Part 5 of the *Police Act*;
- 9 EPS Matter; and
- 67 Citizen Contacts.

The Edmonton Police Service received 30,833 calls in Communications Section, dispatched 12,903 of those calls and recorded opening 8 compliments.

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STATISTICAL SUMMARY

April Update

1. RECEIVED FILES

The following figure shows the number and type of files received during the month of April. Blue colours represent informal files and red colours represent formal investigations. Lighter shades indicate internally generated files and darker shades indicate externally generated files. As can be seen below, during the month of April 2015, PSB received 65 informal files and 15 formal complaints.

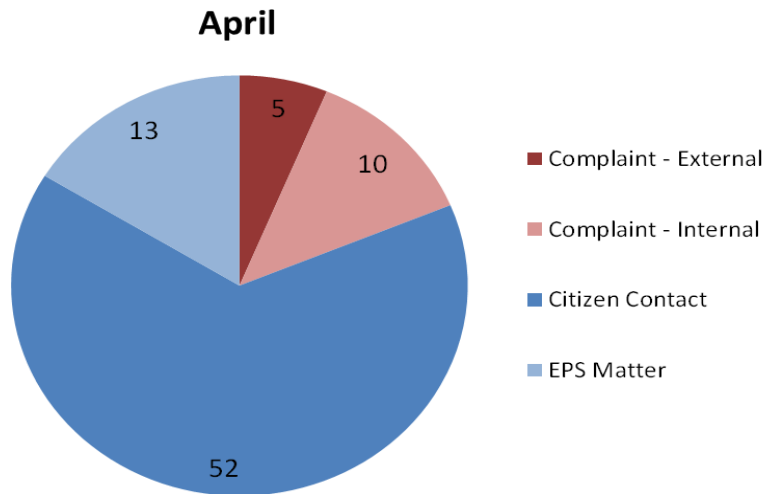


Figure 1-1. Type of Files Received During April

The following figure shows the yearly percentage increase or decrease in formal complaints and total files compared to 2014 values. YTD change in Formal Complaints represents a decrease of 6 complaints as compared to the same point in time in 2014. The YTD Total Files Received represents a decrease of 3 files as compared to the same point in time in 2014.

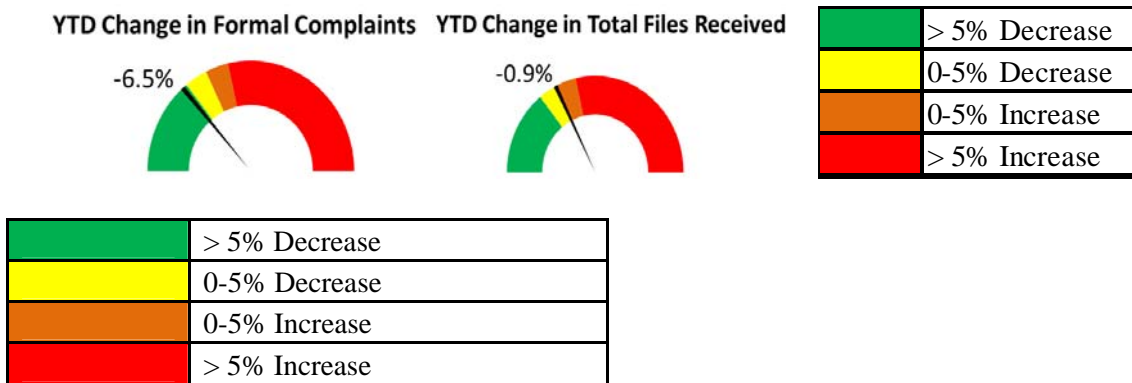
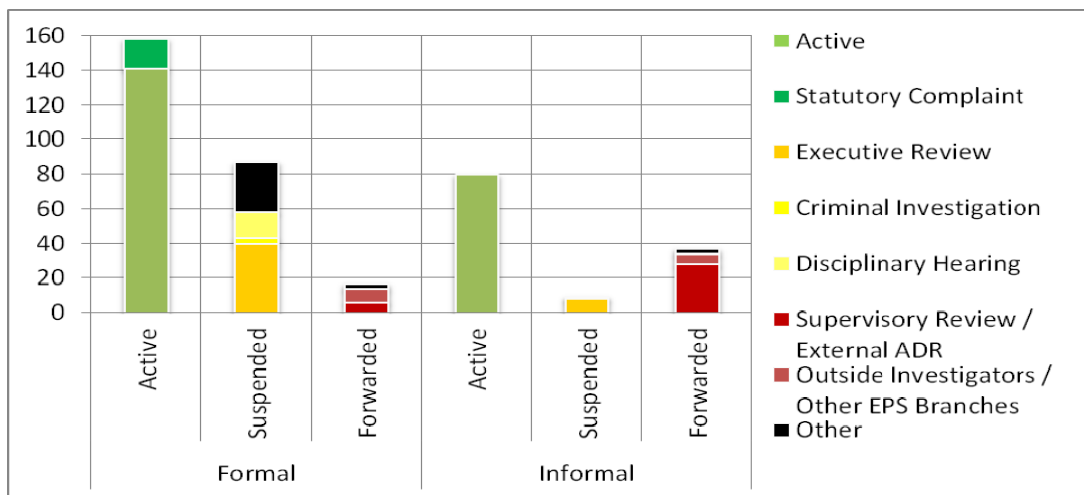


Figure 1-2. Yearly Changes in Files Received

2. CURRENT WORKLOAD

The following figure displays the status of all open PSB files. As of April 30, 2015, PSB had 388 open investigations; 262 of those files are *Police Act* or statutory investigations with completed formal complaints. The remaining files are informal concerns received internally or from the public. An investigation is listed as “Suspended” when it is not currently being advanced. Reasons for suspending a file may include executive review of the investigation, disciplinary hearings, criminal investigation, or court proceedings. An investigation is listed as “Forwarded” when it is ongoing but not under the control of PSB. Reasons for forwarding a file may include supervisory reviews, obtaining legal opinions, or investigation by outside investigators.



*** As of April 30, 2015 there were 25 Statutory Complaints open, of which 4 were associated to completed PSB files. Therefore they are not considered duplicates and are included in the chart ***

Figure 2-1. Status of All Open Investigations and Reasons for Suspension or Forward

The following table shows the age and status of all open PSB investigations, including all Statutory Complaints. As with the definitions for Figure 2-1 the following table will show files that are listed as Active, Suspended, and Forwarded. This table will break down these files by year, that will show the total number of files in each status for the corresponding year (i.e. 2010 has a total of 4 open files, of those 3 files are Suspended and 1 is Forwarded).

The following figure shows the stage of investigation for formal complaints by month. This is a snapshot of the files that were in a particular stage as of the last day of the month.

The stages of investigation include:

- Clarification (interviewing the complainant to determine the specific details of the complaint);
- Collection (collection of evidence and witness interviews);
- Subject Officer Interviews (explanatory reports and/or interview of the subject officer);
- Report (compiling the final report);
- Investigative Review (review by the Investigative Manager);
- Executive Review (review by the Inspector, Chief, and final concluding processes).

Investigations may also be pending other processes (e.g., dispute resolution, legal review, hearing, etc.) or may be undetermined (e.g., for complaints that are not proceeding to formal investigation).

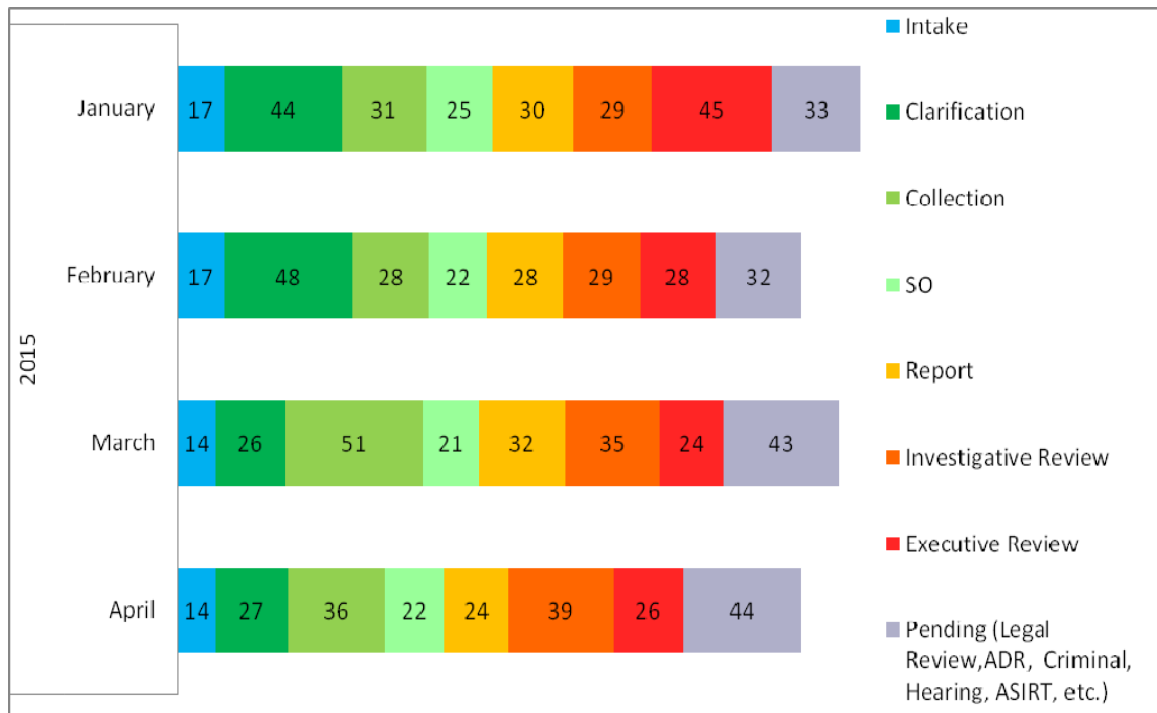


Figure 2-3. Monthly Comparison of Complaint Stages

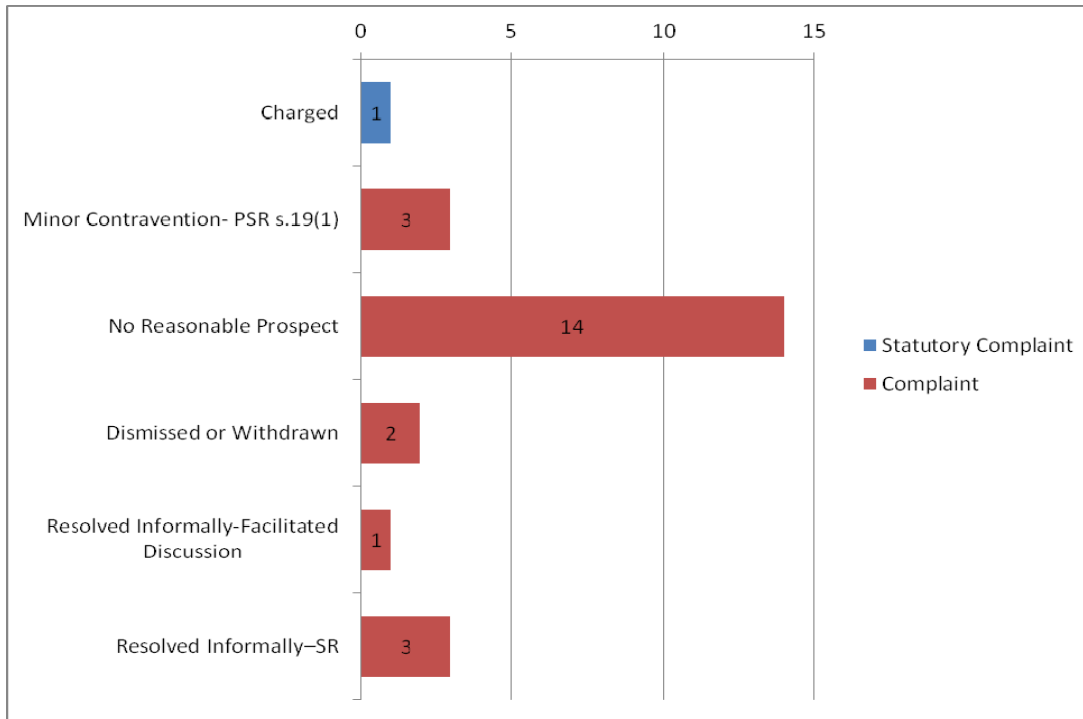


Figure 3-1. Dispositions of Concluded Formal Complaints

Summary

PSB received a written letter of complaint on October 10, 2014, where an opinion was expressed about speed traps on the roadway which was believed to be unnecessary and unsafe, according to the complainant. The complainant believed that photo radar would be sufficient. And that at the particular location where the complainant received a ticket was considered to be unsafe. Upon review there was no evidence to support that the particular location where a "speed trap" was positioned was unsafe. Nor any other "speed traps" operated by EPS as alleged. Selected enforcement sites are necessary for the purpose of addressing speeding offences pursuant to the *Alberta Traffic Safety Act*, and the diligence of enforcing traffic laws remains a priority for EPS members. It was determined that training was not an issue and that current EPS Policies and Procedures were sufficient. The Chief concluded this matter on April 15, 2015.

Summary

PSB received an emailed complaint with regard to the response time of 911 Police Dispatch. The complainant stated that 911 Police Dispatch was called at three separate times, 8:09, 8:28, and 8:43. The complainant had someone in her residence who was intoxicated that refused to leave the premises. The complainant agreed to have their concerns reviewed by the division. As such, the complainant was contacted and the events of that evening were explained and that the incident could have been changed to a higher priority but that it was a judgment call and not policy. The complainant was satisfied with the explanation provided and agreed that their concerns were concluded. This matter was concluded April 10, 2015.
