1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Palmer called the meeting to order at 1:00 P.M. and welcomed everyone.

She acknowledged and welcomed Assistant Chief Troy Gay who was visiting from the Austin Police Department, Texas.

6. PRESENTATION

6.1 Responsible Hospitality Industry Association (RHIA)

Two members of the RHIA presented to the Commission. They advised that the Edmonton Late Night Hospitality Industry presented to the Commission at its September 19, 2013 public meeting and expressed the need for something like a Hospitality Policing Unit (HPU). Since that time the RHIA formed. It approached the Edmonton Police Service with regard to assisting with policing issues. The Service's formation of its HPU has been an asset for the RHIA. The RHIA has an excellent relationship with the EPS.

Late night venues are pleased with the support provided by HPU both inside and outside the venues and have found that safety concerns have improved. They suggested that more attention be paid to patrolling the perimeters around parking lot areas. RHIA is willing to participate in any way it can.

7. CHIEF'S REPORT

7.1 Q3 2016 Annual Policing Plan: Public Initiatives

Superintendent Tawfik introduced Mr. Daniel Spanu, Supervisor, Strategic Planning, Evaluation and Research Unit.

Mr. Spanu provided an update on the 2016 Annual Policing Plan (APP) Q3 results and the public dashboard. He advised that Q3 is the first time the Service has had a live dashboard. He displayed what is posted on the City website. It was updated November 9, 2016. He added that the Service will advise the Commission each time the dashboard goes live. The APP shows year to date statistics, the dashboard shows quarterly statistics.

He spoke to the purpose of the APP and highlighted each initiative, target and status. The Q3 report provides crime level and socio-economic correlations, which was requested at the time of the Q2 report. Another request brought forward with the Q2 report was around distracted driving; how many tickets go to court, how many are thrown out of court and how many are convictions. This information will be provided with the Q4 report. Chief Knecht added that incidents of distracted driving are rising. It is the most serious contributor to injury and death.

Chief Knecht and Deputy Chief Harder responded to questions.

Commissioner Ruth drew attention to the two domestic violence indicators, offender checks and victim checks, referenced in the APP. She noted that the results for the number of checks for both indicators are up over last year. She asked if the recidivism rate has been reduced and how the impact of the check program is being assessed. She asked that the Service report back on this at the Commission's January 2017 public meeting.

Chair Palmer thanked Mr. Spanu for his report.
